Registration Fees and Travel

The cost of attending SREB’s College- and Career-Readiness Standards Networking Conference and Making Schools Work Conference is low compared to many conferences, and registration fees include hot lunches on main conference days. SREB’s negotiated room rates at conference hotels start at just \$149 (double occupancy), and flights to Baltimore’s BWI airport are typically inexpensive compared to other destinations.
