The Southern Regional Education COMPACT

HEREAS, the States who are parties hereto have during the past several years conducted careful investigation looking toward the establishment and maintenance of jointly owned and operated regional educational institutions in the Southern States in the professional, technological, scientific, literary and other fields, so as to provide greater educational advantages and facilities for the citizens of the several States who reside within such region; and

WHEREAS, Meharry Medical College of Nashville, Tennessee, has proposed that its lands, buildings, equipment, and the net income from its endowment be turned over to the Southern States, or to an agency acting in their behalf, to be operated as a regional institution for medical, dental and nursing education upon terms and conditions to be hereafter agreed upon between the Southern States and Meharry Medical College, which proposal, because of the present financial condition of the institution, has been approved by the said States who are parties hereto; and

WHEREAS, the said States desire to enter into a compact with each other providing for the planning and establishment of regional educational facilities;

OW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual agreements, covenants and obligations assumed by the respective States who are parties hereto (hereinafter referred to as "States"), the said several States do hereby form a geographical district or region consisting of the areas lying within the boundaries of the contracting States which, for the purpose of this compact, shall constitute an area for regional education supported by public funds derived from taxation by the constituent States and derived from other sources for the establishment, acquisition, operation and maintenance of regional educational schools and institutions for the benefit of citizens of the respective States residing within the region so established as may be determined from time to time in accordance with the terms and provisions of this compact.

The States do further hereby establish and create a joint agency which shall be known as the Board of Control for Southern Regional Education (hereinafter referred to as the "Board"), the members of which Board shall consist of the Governor thereof, at least one of whom shall be selected from the field of education. Vacancies on the Board caused by death, resignation, refusal or inability to serve, shall be filled by appointent by the Governor for the unexpired portion of the term. The officers of the Board shall be a Chairman, a Vice Chairman, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and such additional officers as may be created by the Board from time to time. The Board shall have the right to formulate and

62% of students met both SAT benchmarks in Alabama, 16 percentage points above the national average of 46% in 2021.



74.3% was the **6-year graduation rate** for first-time, full-time freshman at public 4year colleges in Delaware. This exceeds the national and regional averages of 62.5% and 60%.



A leader in computer science education

72 % of students met both SAT benchmarks in Arkansas, 26 percentage points above the national average of 46% in 2021.



34% of graduating seniors passed an AP exam in high school in Florida in 2020, 9.8 percentage points above the national average of 24%.





77 Georgia principals completed SREB's induction program during the 22-23 school year.



68% of students met both SAT benchmarks in Louisiana, 22 percentage points above the national average of 46% in 2021.

Kentucky is collaborating with SREB on a U.S. Department of Education grant, the first study in the nation to focus on the professional learning for **leaders of shared-time technical centers**.



The percentage of people in Maryland aged 25-64 with a **bachelor's degree or higher reached 44%** in 2021. This is higher than the national average of 36.5%





71% of students met both SAT benchmarks in Mississippi, 25 percentage points above the national average of 46% in 2021.



Oklahoma's robust **school report card** provides one of the most disaggregated reports on teacher quality and distribution of talent by student economic, racial and ethnic, learning and family and home status.



The 6-year graduation rate is 67.8% in North Carolina for first-time, full-time freshman at 4-year colleges. This exceeds national and regional averages of 62.5% and 60%.



The South Carolina Council on Competitiveness worked with SREB to conduct a study and support the development of South Carolina's **artificial intelligence education standards** for high school students.





75% of students met both SAT benchmarks in Tennessee, 29 percentage points above the national average of 46% in 2021.



The percentage of people in Virginia aged 25-64 with a **bachelor's degree or higher reached 44%** in 2021, higher than the national average of 36.5%.


The average **student loan debt** for the graduating class of 2020 in Texas was **4 percentage points lower** than that of the graduating class of 2015.
