#### Location

The Annual Meeting and Conference of the SREB Council on Collegiate Education for Nursing will be held at the **JW Marriott Hotel** in the heart of Atlanta's Buckhead community — **3300 Lenox Road N.E.** The hotel is connected by an enclosed promenade to the shopping and dining areas of Lenox Mall and within walking distance to Phipps Plaza.

The **JW Marriott Hotel Buckhead** has reserved a block of rooms for participants at \$179 per night (single or double occupancy).
